**4. FIRST-AID GUIDE:**

**Inhalation**

If breathing is difficult, remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing.

## **5. FIRE-FIGHTING GUIDE:**

### **Suitable extinguishing media**

Water spray, fog, CO<sub>2</sub>, dry chemical, or alcohol resistant foam.

### **Unsuitable extinguishing media**

Do not use a solid water stream as it may scatter and spread fire.

### **Specific hazards arising from the chemical**

Fire may produce irritating, corrosive and/or toxic gases.

### **Special protective equipment and precautions for firefighters**

Firefighters must use standard protective equipment including flame retardant coat, helmet with face shield, gloves, rubber boots, and in enclosed spaces, SCBA. Structural firefighters protective clothing will only provide limited protection. Wear self-contained breathing apparatus with a full face piece operated in the positive pressure demand mode when fighting fires.

### **Fire-fighting equipment/instructions**

In case of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. Use standard firefighting procedures and consider the hazards of other involved materials. Move containers from fire area if you can do so without risk. Water runoff can cause environmental damage. Ventilate closed spaces before entering them. ## **6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE GUIDE:**

### **Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures**

Keep unnecessary personnel away. Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Ventilate closed spaces before entering them. Eliminate all sources of ignition. Avoid contact with skin or inhalation of spillage, dust or vapor.

### **Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up**

Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks or flames in immediate area). Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Absorb with inert absorbent such as dry clay, sand or diatomaceous earth, commercial sorbents, or recover using pumps.

The product is immiscible with water and will spread on the water surface.

Large Spills: Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Cover with plastic sheet to prevent spreading. Prevent product from entering drains. Do not allow material to contaminate ground water system. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers.

Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.

Never return spills in original containers for re-use. This material and its container must be disposed of as hazardous waste.

### **Environmental precautions**

Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Do not contaminate water. Retain and dispose of contaminated wash water. Avoid release to the environment. Contact local authorities in case of spillage to drain/aquatic environment.

### **Precautions for safe handling**

Do not handle or store near an open flame, heat or other sources of ignition. Take precautionary measures against static discharges. All equipment used when handling the product must be grounded.
